I greatly value the role that Societies have in promoting multilevel dissemination of knowledge and resources. I have served in important leadership roles in national and international societies including : member of the ExCo of the European Academy of Andrology for eight years, Member of the Nominee Committee of the European Society of Endocrinology for three years, Treasurer of the International Society of Andrology for three years, Scientific Committee of SIE for 6 years, POC for ESE in Lisbon, and the last, very important, nomination as clinical POC Chair for the ENEA 2022. All these roles prepared me for such an important task that it would be to take part in the ENEA ExCo.

I believe that ENEA is key to drive clinical care in neuroendocrinology through education, to foster young researchers toward pituitary disease and to advance endocrine research with international reputation. Having a multinational ExCo, facilitating connections within European activities – workshops and meetings – increasing ENEA visibility and the participation of young researchers will be among my main objectives.

I was initiated to neuroendocrinology in an international context, in London at St. Bartholomew's Hospital and past and active collaboration with Universities in Oxford (UK), London (UK), Athens (GR), Copenhagen (DK), Lund (NL), Munster (DE).

With my research I have contributed to different areas of endocrinology publishing over 200 International Peer-Reviewed articles, with an overall Impact Factor of 692 points (Total Citations 7879, h-index 48 by Scopus)(G-Scholar h-index 60).

I believe in the value of translational research -from bench to bedside and vice-versa- and the promotion of a multidimensional neuroendocrinology addressing aspects that are off the beaten track, such as immuno-endocrinology, chronobiology, fertility and oncology.
